greetings!

It is with joy that we share with you our 2018 Annual Report. The year marked the 10th birthday of Imagine LA's model: empowering families to transition from homelessness onto solid pathways out of poverty through our unique blend of intensive case management and volunteer mentoring. It was a year of remarkable growth — we served 105 families compared to 42 in 2017. This growth was fueled by funding provided by LA County Department of Health Services Housing for Health via Measure H and licensing our model to The Whole Child to form Imagine Whittier.

We honored Serena Williams at our 5th annual Imagine Ball, which was star-studded and hilarious! With help from Dave Chappelle, Chris Rock, Michelle Williams and Busta Rhymes, it sold out and the funds raised hit record highs. We continued to build consistent and diverse sources of funding and ended 2018 in the strongest cash position since our founding; plus, our cost per family served decreased significantly.

Our impact is strong — all 2018 graduates maintained housing, are utilizing regular health care and have increased their financial wellness — with 40% of adults increasing their earned income, and everyone either working or on school or workforce development pathways. Our youth are progressing wonderfully with the youngest reaching development milestones, children attending school, finding passions and, if applicable, graduating and pursuing college or trade tech.

In the later part of 2018, we undertook a robust strategic planning process, chaired by incoming Board Chair Teddy Kapur. What emerged is a three-year blueprint for program enhancement, capacity building and continued growth in South LA, Mid-City, San Fernando Valley and West LA. Program enhancements include building systematic workforce development and living wage job pathways with childcare for our families, technical and staff infrastructure to support growth, vibrant community engagement, and fund development capacity — plus exploring further opportunities to train and license our model to others.

Thank you for your generosity in helping Imagine LA get to this point. We hope you will continue to engage in this life-changing journey with us!

In 2017, we worked with 42 families and had worked with 125+ families and 500 volunteers cumulatively since the inception of the program in 2008. In 2018 alone, we worked with 105 families (including the 15 families served by our new licensed affiliate, Imagine Whittier). We increased our staff by 25%, doubled our work in South LA and mid-City, and set the stage to grow in the San Fernando Valley and West LA. We aim to be empowering 250 families and

750-1,000 mentors by 2022.





Imagine LA's unique Family Empowerment & Mentorship (FEM) model provides families who have experienced homelessness (and are now in housing) with intensive case management, volunteer mentorship, workforce development, and resource linkages over a minimum 12- to 18-month period.


Our program staff helps families set goals and access private and public resources; our community engagement team joins in to recruit and train volunteers to offer 1:1 mentorship to each member of the family (over age 5) and provide a financial wellness mentor to the head of household.

While most other homeless housing case management services focus their support on the adult head of household, Imagine LA effectively works with whole families both in permanent supportive housing and scattered site apartments. Our model empowers the whole family to stabilize, build relationships, habits and skills, increase income, and integrate into their communities so they are set up to thrive long term and break their cycle of poverty and homelessness.


2018 PROGRAM GRADUATES

In our first few years, 90% of our mentors were Caucasian and most lived on the West side. As these graphs show, we have diversified the make-up of our volunteer base. We have purposefully diversified our volunteer mentor base to better reflect the rich diversity of cultures living in LA. Similarly, we have made strides in matching mentors with families who live and/or work nearby.


TOTAL CHANGE IN NET ASSETS
